





***Uncommon Landscapes* featuring Capucine Bourcart and Sui Park**

July 13 through August 31, 2016

NEW YORK, NY (July 6, 2016) – HARLEM, NY. *Uncommon Landscapes* featuring Capucine Bourcart and Sui Park opens Wednesday, July 13, 6:00 PM to 9:00 PM at Art in FLUX, 163 Lenox Avenue between 118th and 119th Street.

Capucine Bourcart and Sui Park are two quite remarkable artists with an astute attention to detail. Both city-dwellers, Capucine hailing from Harlem via Alsace, France and Sui from Queens via Seoul, Korea, they each bring a perspective on the landscape that is individual and perhaps eccentric. The final result of their toiling in detail is exceptionally refined and surprising.

Bourcart traverses the city with her camera, documenting by color and then rearranging photo fragments in meticulously layered monochromatic designs. Upon closer inspection, it becomes apparent that it's not just about color. Throughout her multi-layered landscapes, comprised of minute details, the city's textures, tags and markings of all kinds begin to appear, revealing the history of the documented neighborhood. Each collection of color is a magnifying glass to this fascinating and complex city.

When Park approaches a project, she has an innate sense and interconnectedness about and with her surroundings. Molecules appear to float around her, hills and pathways undulate, and walls no longer seem fixed. The inorganic, ubiquitous materials she uses (cable ties or fishing wire), take on particularly natural inimitable three-dimensional formations. Sui creates a new landscape by interrupting rigid city spaces with amoebic forms that take on a life of their own, coaxing fluidity in environs that without her influence exist with lines, edges and constraints.

Neither artist would be placed in the category of a "landscape" artist, Bourcart a photographer and Sui working in three-dimension, but their inspiration comes from keen observation, meticulous documentation and a call and response to their surroundings.

About the Artists

Capucine Bourcart originally hails from Alsace, France. She has called Harlem, New York her home for more than a decade. Primarily self-taught in photography, she has refined her skills at the International Center of Photography, New York, where she studied and also worked as an Assistant Teacher. She is fascinated by details, inspired by personal interactions, and she structures her creative process with visual fragments that she collects in her daily life, travels, and relationships. She presented solo exhibitions at Nidau Gallery, Nidau Switzerland and Galerie de la Baie, France. Her works have been featured in *Le Temps*, *Destination* and *Le Journal des Arts*. Her work has been exhibited and resides in private and museum collections in Europe and in New York. She was featured in FLUX Art Fair, May 2015 and was an award-winning artist at FLUX Public Art Projects, May 2016.

Sui Park is a New York based artist and an interior architect born in Seoul, Korea. Her work involves creating 3-dimensional flexible organic forms that are dynamic, mystical and illusionary. Her solo exhibitions included Denise Bibro Fine Art Gallery in Chelsea, New York, April 2016 and Kingsborough Community College, CUNY, Brooklyn, NY, March 2016. She participated in over 30 exhibitions including Governors Island Art Fair, Governors Island, NY, September 2015, FLUX Art Fair, May 2015 and FLUX Public Art Projects, May 2016. Sui Park is a Bronze Awardee in 2013-2014 *A' Design Award* in Arts, Crafts and Ready-Made Design Category with her design *SuiTable*. Sui Park's education includes an MDes in Interior Architecture at Rhode Island School of Design, 2013 and BFA in Environmental Design at Maryland Institute College of Art, 2011. Sui Park also has MFA and BFA in Fiber Art from Ewha Womans University, Seoul, Korea.
